

The December 12th meeting will be hosted by Kay Johnson at Ruby Tuesday's in Mount Vernon.






We were welcomed to the EAA Clubhouse on the airport by our hostess Kay Johnson. A lively aviation discussion was already in progress. Our speaker, Bruce Johnson, and his AI friend Sam were relating some of their aviation experiences. Then, LTC. Johnson told us about his life. He soloed in March 1974 and has been flying for 47 years. (His mom Kay has been a 99 since 1977). Bruce noted that, "luck is being prepared when opportunity knocks." He has flown for American Airlines for 38 years. He flew the 727 when it had two ADFs, two VORs, and an NDB. He also flew the DC-9. In 1992 he was promoted to captain after eight years on the job. All flights in the USA are "routine training" flights. He worked as an accident creator of accidents he had previously investigated for training purposes. In the military, he flew the A7 for ten years and the F16 out of Springfield air base. In 1996 he was a member of a squadron of F-16s in Kuwait, flying the northern and southern watches. He noted that the A-10 was flown in circles around any downed aircraft to protect the crew on the ground. He was also in the National Air Defense at WPAFB in Dayton. He is now retired from the Air National Guard. When he was building his home in Alexandria, he built the runway and airstrip for his Highlander before the house was started. Now there's an aviator with his priorities straight! Thank you, colonel, for an enlightening talk and to Kay for inviting him!

Peg Ballou will host the **SATURDAY October 16th** meeting at Port Bucyrus Airport Days for the Bucyrus bicentennial. Please see the flyer in this newsletter. There should be food vendors. and Peg will re-enact Lauretta Schimmoler, the first woman airport manager in the USA, movie advisor, pilot, good friend of Amelia Earhart, and first 99s secretary. A monument at the airport to Lauretta is planned using donations: \$10 per person and \$5 per car. There will be a C-130 and other aircraft on display, and an F-16 fly-over. Valerie Palazzolo has volunteered to host the November 14th meeting as a carry-in at the Columbus airport.
