Thanks a lot to Lisa and her 49 1/2 for cooking and hosting this meeting!

Lisa introduced the guest speaker, retired Police Detective Ryan Gilmore, who was a police officer for 28 years. He now flies drones for search and rescue missions and sponsors the Willard High School Drone Club. He stated that drone operation is subject to two FAA rules: Part 107 is less than 700 pages and pertains to licensing, including recreational flying. Drones must be registered under Part 107. A new FAA rule requires remote ID. There is a maximum weight of 55 pounds. There is a short written test with no flight test, that can be taken online if one is a private pilot. The initial test must be at PSI. It's a two year license that can be renewed online. Mr. Gilmore recommends drone operators have a pilot's license. There are drone simulators that use a computer and goggles to practice operation. If one flies for money then a Part 107 certificate is required. Part 61 covers drones weighing more than 55 pounds. Drone operation is line of sight or with someone in contact with the drone in communication with the pilot. There is a waiver for emergencies, such as a search in the woods where the operator can't maintain eye contact with the drone. Drones must be operated less then 400 feet AGL, and below the clouds, or have a waiver.

Sky Vector has notams. Weather must be checked. If one needs permission to fly in a certain airspace then use the LANCE APP and you will get a phone clearance fast. Drones must avoid and yield to manned aircraft. One can obtain low altitude authorization and notification. Lighted drones with a white strobe on top are allowed to operate if the light is visible for 3 sm. Drone can speed to 87kph or 100 mph. Accidents must be reported within seven days. Commercial drones must have a transponder. Some areas have geo-fencing which prevents drones from starting their engines.

Mr. Gilmore works for the City of Willard, which insures the drone. His drone has thermal imaging (FLIR) and tele-zoom. To activate the Search and Rescue emergency missions, someone's life must be in danger. Getting a drone into the air is much faster than waiting for a OSP helicopter or fixed wing aircraft to get to the scene. Incident Command (IC) can activate a drone with TV and live feed. Some have four cameras, including thermal and zoom options.

The Civil Air Patrol (CAP) makes Disaster Assessments to activate them. Our members, Lisa Blair and Claire Gerber are members of the CAP. Lisa piqued our interest further by showing her personal drone. Thanks for hosting and for a great program, Lisa!


