It was after I heard her radio communication with the ATC during the Flight 1380 accident, that I couldn't stop thinking about it and started wondering what if I could do something like that.. what if I could become a pilot!

She told me that 2 of her talk events were happening the next day... I contemplated overnight, and decided on Thursday morning that I extend my volunteering at Oshkosh so I could attend those events!! (I even canceled my flight lesson.) It was wonderful that I got to hear Capt Shults talk, and ask questions in person! Cat had to leave on Thursday morning as planned, so I had to figure out how to get home.. My husband and kids ended up driving up to Oshkosh, joining me on Saturday to enjoy the AirVenture, and we all drove home together on Sunday! My husband told me that the night airshow was the best fireworks he's ever seen! We arrived home after midnight and have been busy ever since.. my husband left for his 2-week TDY early this morning. I have so much to catch up on, and it's the final week of this semester with lots of homework..

But, I am planning to attend the meeting next Sunday! (Maybe driving up there with the boys).

Amelia Earhart Day

his day honors the famous aviation pioneer, Amelia Earhart, born on this date in 1897. Earhart was the first aviatrix to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean, for which she received the United States Distinguished Flying Cross.

She also wrote best-selling books about her flying experiences, and was instrumental in the formation of the Ninety-Nines (an organization for female pilots).

Earhart disappeared in July of 1937 over the central Pacific Ocean near Howland Island, during an attempt to make a circumnavigational flight of the globe. The where-abouts of her remains has been source of much speculation over the years.

Recently, though, more than 81 years after her disappearance, a researcher affiliated with the University of Tennessee has re-examined data from bones found on remote Nikumaroro Island just three years after

Earhart vanished. He has determined they very likely are Earhart's

remains after being initially incorrectly identified as male bones in 1940 and dismissed as relevant to the Earhart case.

"The data revealed that the bones have more similarity to Earhart than to 99 percent of individuals in a large reference sample," a statement said.

Earhart will always be remembered as the embodiment of the American pioneering spirit, and a role-model to women of all ages.
