1. Go to <http://www.ninety-nines.org>

3. Click on Directory in list on top right, type in All-Ohio Chapter in the Chapter box and click on Search. Note: You can search on any of the boxes. It's an easy way to find a specific member, find members nearby or a member in an area you will be visiting.
4. An alphabetical list of all of our members will come up.

Here is a report from Peg about a recent trip that she and Sam took. It shows us the immense possibilities we have as aircraft owners and pilots!



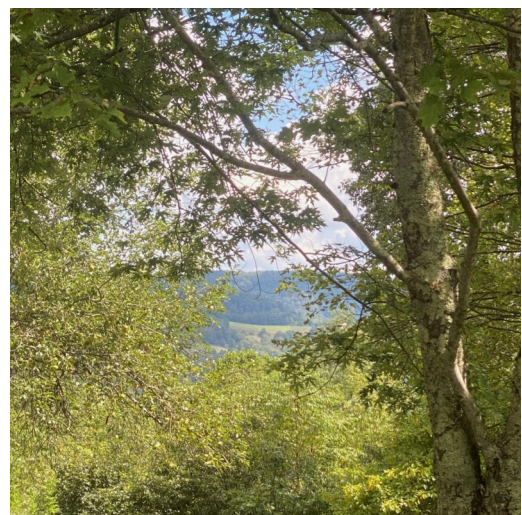
This is cheat river 56WV
